

# Boy Scout Program

## Orange District 2011 Fall Camporee Camp Cherokee, Yanceyville, N. C.

**November 4-6, 2011**

The **Boy Scout** activity at the Orange District 2011 Fall Camporee will be a **Patrol Camping and Cooking demonstration competition**. The Boy Scouts will have the morning and early afternoon to prepare for their demonstration. In the middle of the afternoon, the Patrols will go around to view and judge the other patrols. The judging will be based on how well each Patrol adheres to their chosen style. Judging will also include points for Patrol identity and organization (Patrol flags, posted menus, duty roster, etc.). All presentations should include an explanation of the advantages and disadvantages of the chosen style and how the Patrol demonstrated that style. Prizes will be given for 1<sup>st</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> place.

The Camping styles are: “Backpacking” “Weekend” (close vehicular access) and “Long Term” All styles should exemplify good Scout camping practices.

The Cooking styles are: “Dutch Oven/Cast Iron”, “One Pot”, “Tin Foil”, “Backpacking Stove(s)”, “Camping Stove(s)” and “Only over the Fire”.

All food will be prepared and/or cooking by 3:00 p.m. At least a sample of each item being cooked should be cooking by 3:00 p.m. The remainder of the food can be started to cook at the appropriate time for a 5:30 p.m. dinner.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> year Webelos to tour the Patrol sites after the Patrol judging. There will be an ongoing activity for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year Webelos where they will interact with the Boy Scouts. Each Webelos and Boy Scout will have beads to exchange. The Webelos will have a cord onto which the Boy Scout will tie his bead with one of five knots. The knots are; Square Knot, 2 Half Hitches,, Taut Line, Figure 8 and Bowline. The Boy Scout must use a knot that has not been used on the Webelos’s cord.

The Patrols will also be asked to prepare a short (Scout appropriate) skit or song for the campfire Saturday night
